- Is this ability /skill in line with my child's interests and learning style?




When Choosing a Subject Combination (2)

- Encouraging them to take up different activities and help them to reflect on their strengths and interests



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

Out-of Stream (Express) Subject

- Students may be offered Out-of Stream (OOS) if they have passed either
 - 2022 Subject-Based Banding (SBB) Subject or
 - · at least 75% (overall) in a subject
- Offer is also dependent on whether the subject is offered to 2023 Secondary 3 Express students



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Changes to Grades Reflected on Result Slip and Examination Certificate

- · Grade U in N(A)-Level examinations will be replaced with Grade 6
- N(A)-Level Grade 6 cannot be used for aggregate computation for admission to Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP), Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP) and Sec 5.
- They can be used for ITE admissions (except for courses with specific Minimum Entry Requirements).
- All grades, including the O-Level Grade 9, N(A)-Level Grade 6 will be reflected in the student's result slip and examination certificate.

NAVAL BASE SECONDARY SCHOOL Frequently Asked Questions

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Q: How does my child decide whether to take Physics or Biology?

- The Science teachers would have informed your child which are the topics in the Sec 2 syllabus are Physics or Biology related.
- There's also an SLS module given to them to help them decide on what is their interest.



Q: Does the school offer AMath for NA?

- For students who are good in Mathematics, we offer Express Mathematics instead of NA AMath.
- · This would be more beneficial for their PFP/DPP applications.
- AMath is **not** compulsory for JC/Polytechnic.



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
